I received a phone call from a lady who had worked with Esther in the local school system a few years ago. She wanted me to visit her husband who was in a coma at the local hospital in Ganado. Sam Todacheenie had been a strong rancher, but now his body was emaciated. His wife told me he had indicated before he went comatose that he wanted to go to Ganado Baptist Church. He could not speak now, but he could squeeze your hand in response to questions. I witnessed to Sam, not knowing what he could understand. After I explained the way of salvation, I asked Sam if he would receive Christ. He squeezed my hand as I led him in the sinner's prayer. A few days later, Sam passed away. I am so glad that the Lord provided this opportunity to tell him of God's saving grace. At his funeral, there were five or six people who responded to the invitation to receive Christ.

About a week or so later, there was another funeral I was asked to officiate. The woman was the mother of one of our faithful ladies. She had a good testimony and again, we preached the Gospel. There were five or six more folks who responded to the invitation. I am truly grateful to the Lord for these chances to present salvation.
