News From Our Missionaries

Don & Flo McMillan (Brazil-Retired) "The works in Brazil are doing well even during a time of economic difficulty, wrote Bro. Don. "We thank the Lord for the offering of one thousand dollars that one church gave because the dollar had lost so much of its value in Brazil." Sending in thousands of Bibles and lessons last year cost \$62,689 for postage. The McMillans ask that you consider giving an offering for postage. If this is possible, please mark on the check or paperwork "Postage" so they'll know what it's for. They also have ministries with the sick, shut-ins, & mentally challenged. One young lady was saved & baptized and now all the members of the class are saved! The work with the Rock of Ages Prisoner Discipleship Institute is reaching over 18,000 prisoners. Last year, 3,712 were saved.



CL Jones (Mexico) CL spent 18 days in Monterey, Mexico, and helped in eight congregations, six churches, and two missions. The Lord blessed with many coming to the altars. Nov. 8th was a big day for the Gethsemane Baptist Church. It was the conclusion of their mission conference and the 24th anniversary of the church. God is blessing the church under the leadership of Pastor Abram Alvarado. The Sunday school averages 140-150. They support several missionaries. Recently, the church called Bro. Eliazar Luna to work with Bro. Alvarado. In the afternoon CL and Katherine (with the Lord) were honored as founders of the church.

Darrain & Mari Coker (Mexico) The Cokers are ministering in Piedras Negras, Coahuila, where Bro. Darrain teaches God's word in Spanish. The Cokers are thankful for your prayers for the Pastor Conference where they had a great number of churches represented. There was lots of preaching & fellowship. They have the following prayer requests: 1) For the ones who made decisions to follow the Lord in baptism, 2) Aurelio, a young man who trusted in Christ as Saviour, 3) spiritual & physical strength for the Cokers, 4) for their furlough beginning in Sept. 2010. Pray also they can present their missionary endeavors in new churches to raise support to start a new work in Mexico.

True & Diana Hawkins (Brazil) The Hawkins are returning to Brazil in February. Diana is recovering nicely from a bout with a knee ailment. Wrote Bro. Hawkins, "It has been good to be in some of our supporting churches. Thank you for being so generous and kind to us, and for being an encouragement." Their son, Philip, was able to return home for Christmas. Pastor Miguel, the new preacher at the Bela Vista Baptist Church in Brazil, sent news that they have had several salvations and are planning a baptismal service. The Hawkins ask for prayers for their four construction projects Beruri, Anori, Presidente Figueiredo, and KM 142. All of the Bible schools are finished for the year and are in recess. Bro. True is encouraged by the dedication of the directors and Brazilian churches that have seen the need and make it possible to train men & women. "I can't say how important this effort is to getting the Gospel to the unreached in the interior and to lost tribes. They contribute much (manioc flour, dried meat, fruit, and sometimes money) so that these ministries can continue to teach the people in the Scriptures."

Six new riders received Christ this past month. On Christmas Sunday, there were 50 people on the vans and nearly 100 in the service. Writes Bro. Mark, "It still works to go out into the highways and hedges!!" Daughter Tirzah's Sunday school is growing rapidly and recently four children were led to the Lord. Son Joel & wife Fabi have surrendered to be missionaries to the Navajo Nation. It will be exciting to see how the Lord uses them as the Haynes seek to make Ganado a training center for men to plant churches. Joel & Fabi are also expecting their first child in June. Larry & Regina McKinney (North American Indians) The "old" work in Tacoma, WA, is doing well with good attendance. On a recent Sunday, 90 were there. There are about 20,000 Indian people in Tacoma and a much needed ministry. The "new" work in Portland, OR, is having the normal ups and downs, but the McKinneys are looking to see what the new year brings to the ministry. In Portland recently, there have been four people saved and four re-dedications. The McKinneys ask for prayers for a 12-15-passenger van for their Sunday School growth. Transportation among the Indian people is much needed.

Bill & Sharon Smith (Brazil) Back in Brazil, the Smiths are thankful for the miraculous ways in which all of their medical bills were paid. They want to thank everyone who prayed and gave special offerings. October was the 31st anniversary of the Bible Baptist Church in Caracarai; 175 attended. In November, Bros. Jim Kurtz & Harold Pruner from the Mansfield Baptist Temple visited them and each of the four churches in Caracarai and Boa Vista during their time there. Pastor Paulo and the Bible Baptist Church celebrated their 9th anniversary with a week of meetings. They had over 100 in attendance with 40 coming by bus from 75 miles away. The Smiths traveled by plane to Manaus to attend the Bible Institute graduation which had over 300 in attendance.
