The two pastors & their families came to our house for breakfast & we talked over plans for our churches & how we can unite them in church activities. On March 30th we made a trip to Caracarai to visit some of the people we knew were sick with dengue. It was good to visit with ones we have known & we encouraged them. Sharon's birthday was April 1st.. We ate at a restaurant & while we were waiting to enter we saw the actor that was playing the part of Jesus in the Easter play. The governor of our state was talking with him. Afterwards, the governor turned around, shook hands with us, & wished us a good day. We had to take Pastor Francisco to the emergency room because he hadn't been feeling well. He needed some medication for a virus . He received a shot & felt better, but was still weak. We celebrated the 3rd anniversary of the church on April 9-11. Bro. True Hawkins was invited to preach for the 3-day conference. Both he & his wife, Diana, did good jobs preaching & teaching. 72 were present on Saturday night. Several unsaved people were there & we pray they might make the decision to accept the Lord."

The meeting in Harrah, WA, was a great time. We hold our NABF meeting there every year & we really have a Pow-Wow. Glad to hear some of the young preachers who are coming up. We took a small group from Portland & they came back on fire for the Lord. The Lower Valley Indian Baptist Church is a needed work on that reservation. Pray for Glen & Debbie Hohmann as they labor there. We just had a lot of printed materials done that cost around \$400. Bibles are needed & we would really put those to use. The Warm Springs reservation is just around the corner from us & so is the Celillo Village. We are still commuting 300 miles round trip & the car is holding up, but somewhere in the future I will be asking you to pray for a reliable vehicle. If you have one you want give to the ministry, call the mission office & let them know."

Steven & Mary Earlywine (Mexico) write, "Outside of 'The Mission' of Salinas Victoria, the Great Commission is taking place. There is soul winning, visitation, special meetings, building of a baptistery, teaching, & preaching God's Word to whosoever. Since July 2009, we have seen 120 salvations, eight prospects, two new families (four for security of salvation, two other decisions, & one young lady praying about being a missionary). In Feb., the Mission started supporting Bro. David Eliud, missionary to Spain. We have moved from San Nicolas to a town called Santa Rosa on the north side of Monterrey. Jimmy Harris also needs your prayers. He is still trying to raise funds to move a building to replace the one that was destroyed by fire a year ago. New building codes have caused costs to skyrocket. Please pray for Bro. David Boyd as he leads the church at Brockton, MT. His health is declining. Please pray for me & Connie that we will have the health to fulfill God's purpose for our ministry. MORE FROM REVEREND LESLIE PRIDAY, MISSIONARY TO THE HONDURAS 2010 HONDURAS YOUTH CAMP

During Easter Week (known here as Holy Week), we held our third youth camp in this area. It was Tuesday morning through Saturday morning. We praise the Lord for those who sent special offerings to help lower the costs for the young people. Our theme this year was SOLDIERS OF CHRIST. We had an attendance of forty-nine from six churches from three cities of Honduras. The title of the camp each year is Impactful Baptist Youth. Praise the Lord that the teens said this year was better than last year. Our goal is to equip them be an impact for Christ in the world and their churches, not just be impacted. Alba and I organized and directed the camp. Each morning began with a devotional in cabin lead by the counselors. There were two classes in the morning, one in the afternoon, and a service each night.

Each class dealt with the warfare in which the saved participate. Missionary Harold Priday taught about the War of Temptation and Sin. A Honduran missionary taught about Satan's War Using Music, and a Honduran pastor taught the book of 1 Peter. Each teacher prepared handouts that were given to each teen to take notes so that they would have references for the future. Each night we had a regular service. Several churches prepared special music.. Two missionaries and a Honduran pastor were the speakers for the night services. Each message was a blessing from the Lord. After the service Friday night, we had a bonfire. Each teen and counselor gave a testimony about how the camp had been a blessing to them. As each gave their testimony, they would throw a log or branch on the fire and this served as a lesson how that if we serve the Lord together, our impact will be much greater. This was a sweet time of singing and rejoicing for God's work in each life.

Our sons were a big help in the camp. Edgar helped with the sound system and prepared computer presentations for the singing and the teachers who had their classes in power point format. Halbert organized games and activities for the free times in the mornings, afternoons, and after the night services. We couldn't let them get bored!

The camp ended with a bang though. We are in our dry season and the camp has lots of trees. During the last class on Saturday, we noticed smoke outside. People who live next to the camp's property were burning trash and the property caught on fire. We labored to put out the fire until the fire department arrived. Praise the Lord that there was no damage to any of the buildings. We were all worn out and it was hard to get everyone calm to continue with the last class. But it did serve to prove the point that Satan was not happy with what was going on, even if we all were very happy and excited. Truly, we are in a war with Satan. If it had happened while we were asleep, who knows what the losses would have been. Please pray for our youth that they will stay on fire for the Lord!
