Maintaing the Proper Balance in the Pastoral Ministry

The call to the ministry is the greatest and highest of all callings. No man "puts" himself into the ministry. The true minister of the gospel is called and placed in the ministry by God Himself. Reference the testimony of the Apostle Paul in I Timothy 1:12: "And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that He counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry." Notice who did the "putting": Not Paul, but Jesus. When Jesus puts a man in the ministry, He puts him in to stay. At the same time, He gives him a message, a mandate, and a mission.

How to Maintain Your Balance

After being in the ministry more than sixty-three years, I feel somewhat qualifed to offer the following things that will help any pastor to maintain the proper balance in his God-called

- 1. Be sure your calling is God, rather than an emotional impulse – I Timothy 1:11, 12.
- 2. Be sure you meet the God-given, divinely inspired qualifications of a pastor – I Timothy 3:1-7.
- 3. Be sure you establish the proper relationship with your

people – Galatians 4:15.

- 4. Be sure you understand the primary purpose of your ministry - II Timothy 4:1-8.
- 5. Be sure you budget your time Ephesians 5:16.
- 6. Be sure you devote ample time to the study of the Bible and to the reading of the good books – II Timothy 2:25.
- (I have found that reading the biographies of great men of faith to be most profitiable in my ministry. Men such as J. Frank Norris, D. L. Moody, Charles Haddon Spurgeon, Sam Jones, Billy Sunday, M. F. Ham – to name a few)
- 7. Be sure you stay on track in your preaching program II
- 8. Be sure you maintain proper pastoral conduct— I Timothy 3:2, 3.
- 9. Be sure you keep your eyes on the goal Philippians 3:13. 10. Be sure you are crucified with Christ – Galatians 2:20,
- 11. Be sure you glory only in the cross Galatians 6:14.
- 12. Be sure you maintain a burden for the lost-Romans 10:1.

An effective way to assist you in maintaining the proper balance is on "the firing line," and who can give our students not only a to practice "self-examination":

- Examine your MOUTH Psalm 39:1.
- Examine your HEART Psalm 39:3
- Examine your LIFE Psalm 39:5.
- Examine your HOPE Psalm 39:7.
- ^a Examine your PRAYER Psalm 39:12, 13.
