LET ME SHOW YOU THE WORD OF GOD – PART TWO

Let it be known without any apology, hesitation or reservation, the Bible does not contradict itself. It contradicts those who read it with a mindset to doubt it. Mr. Spurgeon said, "It is a **crime** to add to it, a **treason** to alter it, and a **felony** to take away from it."

The wise man wrote in Proverbs 30:5,6:
"Every Word of God is pure: He is a shield unto them that trust him: Add not to his words lest he reprove thee and thou be found a liar."

The Bible has lifted more spirits, dried more eyes, calmed more fears, generated more hope, blessed more hearts, changed more lives, and comforted more souls than all the books in the world combined, and it is all about Jesus. The Encyclopedia Britannica used 20,000 words to relate the story of Jesus' life and ministry. That is more than the encyclopedia used to tell the stories of Cicero, Aristotle, Alexander the Great, Confucius, and Julius Caesar combined!

You do not find in William Shakespeare's works words like this: "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil for thou art with me." Do not look in Longfellow's poems for "blessed are the poor in spirit..." Keats never wrote anything like "Let not your heart be troubled..." These inspiring, comforting, life-changing words are found only in the blessed, timeless old Book that has sailed every ocean, climbed every mountain, crossed every desert, and circled the globe with the message of salvation by the blood of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God for sinners slain.

Many churches, schools, and religious organizations have relegated the Bible to a secondary place in their programs, and some have abandoned it completely. My plea to all this ecclesiastical nonsense is this:

YOU DID IT AGAIN!

At last year's annual Spring Creek BBQ alumni meeting, several thousand dollars were pledged toward projects and furnishings for the seminary. The funds came in and projects were completed and furnishings secured. The building of a platform for the Conference Center was one of the promised projects. As icing on the cake, just before the start of this year's annual May meeting, it was fashioned by Stan Armstrong and staff members of Heritage Baptist Church of Haslet, TX, a church founded and pastored by an alumnus, Eric Crawford. It is not only spacious, but it also improved the setting and acoustically enhanced the preaching before the people, because of its elevation. Two new pulpits built out of red oak arrived on Monday morning just in time for the first service that night. Pastor Glen Anderson, built four lecterns for us last year, and fashioned these new pulpits to match. The platform and the pulpits were a first fruits of what was again to occur through churches and missionaries, in the giving of funds for some more classroom, office, and dormitory furnishings. 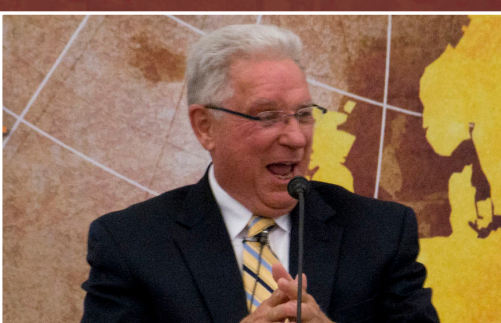
