The Christmas season always reminds us of how important the birth of our Lord and Savior is to us and all mankind. It is the key to all human history, and the event that began the process that will end in His appearance and world-wide reign from Jerusalem.

Family - December and the first part of January were spent taking care of some needed medical for both Diana and me. Thank you very much for the special Christmas gifts; they made it possible for us to do a little more than we had planned. We enjoyed the time here in Derby, Kansas, with Diana's family, and then a "second" Christmas with Nathaniel and grandkids in Colorado. We are awaiting Philip to fly in from his post to finish off the season with a "third" Christmas in early January.

National Missionaries - I received emails from our indigenous missionaries in north Brazil and they had great news to share with us. Missionary Valmir told of the April through December activities; he made two trips up the Uapés (Walpez) River, which has for the first time in history opened up to the Gospel and told of the meetings and opportunity to plant the seeds. He ended out the year at the anniversary conference at the Baptist Church at Pirayawara (Porpoise in the Inyengatu language), where they are expecting a thousand or more. He also reopened the congregation in the Auxiliadora (Help-meet) community on November 9th; it had been closed due to the prolonged illness of their pastor João Bosco. I visited him in Manaus while he was being treated and saw his condition. It is a miracle he is alive; thanks for praying for him. The Rocha (Baptist Church on the Rock) that Valmir organized recently banded together and helped out João Bosco's family with food and finances; this is the very first time I have seen this in that area, and a very encouraging sign.

Plans for 2020 - We will be returning to Brazil on March 24th, if not earlier. Upon arrival, we will try to help out in the Bible Institute (IBBA- Manaus) by teaching and caring for the needs of our national mission. There are four programs that are already set: in May we finish the Bible Institute semester with graduation; June we will have our pastors' congress; in July we will be in Saint Gabriel (600 miles upriver) for the biannual Indigenous Leadership Congress; September 11-12th we will host the annual Ladies Conference in Manaus. Upon arrival we plan to look for and purchase the first motor for the "Outboard Project" so that our missionaries can take the gospel even further interior.

Prayer - Please continue to hold up our pastors and lay people in the Manaus churches. We are going through some of the most difficult times in the history of our movement in Brazil. Remember especially the new board of directors of the institute in Manaus (IBBA) elected for the next two years.

Thank You for another faithful year of prayer and financial support. Missions is a joint effort, and we depend on you as you depend on us. We "...shall part alike." (1 Samuel 30:24)

THE STRENGTH OF A FELLOWSHIP

Some say that a school (Bible Institute, College or Seminary) cannot stand alone without a fellowship. The truth is that if they have enough students and financial support they don’t have to have a fellowship to back them. Some schools exist without associating with a *particular fellowship* group.

Some say that a fellowship has no reason to exist without a school. The truth is there are a number of fellowships that are not connected with a particular school. Their emphasis is on *church planting* and this can be accomplished without a school. A fellowship can raise funds to help start new church plants and restore churches that are struggling and need help both in funds and personnel.

A fellowship can also have a *mission’s agency* to help the missionaries of that fellowship. They do not have to have a school in order to accomplish this. A fellowship can also have an *official publication* that represents and informs the constituents about current events and other information.

To be sure it seems to work better if a fellowship has *a school* they support and recognize it as the school of choice for the majority of churches in that fellowship because men and women need to be trained and prepared for ministry after they surrender for full time service.

Both those *younger* and *older* students who have surrendered their lives for full time ministry need training in the Bible and all areas of ministry.

We, as a fellowship believe that the best scenario for us is to have a *fellowship*, a *school*, a *mission’s agency* and an *official publication*. This requires *“teamwork”* to make the *“dream work”* (our goals). This requires commitment and involvement. A fellowship needs to have churches and pastors that participate.

We need churches and we need Pastors who will lead their churches to support the fellowship *financially*. (The fellowship has many costs including: a home office, equipment, staff, mission’s office, publication and other costs).

The NBBS needs to be *supported by the fellowship* to supplement the educational costs so students can afford to attend. (There are salaries, maintenance, materials and miscellaneous costs as well). We need students from the churches in our fellowship as well as students from other churches to *“feed”* our school with students. A team working together. This is the strength of a fellowship.

THE BOTTOM LINE IS THAT MORE PEOPLE COME TO CHRIST BECAUSE OF OUR WORKING TOGETHER AS A TEAM FOR HIS GLORY!

This brings me to reminding you that our next national meeting will be May 18-21, 2020.
